A MESSAGE FROM WCCFT PRESIDENT

Unions have a long and distinguished history of taking on big issues and making everyday life better for Americans and for people around the globe. Still, it's misleading to think of them as merely "historical"—or even as "them."

Unions are living, breathing, LOCAL entities. They are US. They are YOU. Unions are comprised of, and led by, ordinary people

just like you (and me—until fairly recently, I would never have considered myself material for union leadership!). Union leaders, in the main, are simply people who just wanted to help make things better for themselves and their colleagues and decided to step up to the challenge.

WHAT ABOUT YOU? (YES, YOU!)

There is certainly no shortage of pressing issues on the minds of our members—COVID vaccines and testing, prospects for a safe campus re-entry and effective delivery of services to our students, federal stimulus money and state aid, not to mention social justice issues, fair labor practices, and decent working conditions—and, oh yes, contract negotiations.

Almost two years ago, the current officers and Executive Committee of the WCCFT stepped up. Since then (and much longer for several of them), they have been hard at work addressing these issues and others on behalf of our membership. I can't begin to tell you how proud I am of the terrific work they've done since their election in 2019, and how grateful I am for the way they've consistently advocated for our best interests as faculty.

But, as I announced at the membership meeting on February 3, our current officers, executive committee members, and NYSUT RA delegates are coming to the end of their two-year terms at the close of this semester, which means we will be holding an election. I know that some of them are planning to step down, making room for other members to become WCCFT leaders and bring fresh ideas and broader skill sets.

We have four officer positions (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer), plus eight at-large E-board member positions. All WCCFT members—full-time or part-time, teaching or non-teaching--are entitled to run for a position, either as an officer or an at-large member of the E-board. As many as two officer positions (Secretary and Treasurer) are slated to become available, as well as one at-large position!

NOT FEELING READY FOR E-BOARD MEMBERSHIP OR OFFICE JUST YET?

Another way to be more active and involved in union issues is to become a delegate to the annual Representative Assembly (RA) of the New York State United Teachers (NYSUT, our state affiliate union). The RA is NYSUT's highest policy-making body, comprised of delegates elected from its locals. Those delegates discuss, debate, and vote on proposed amendments to NYSUT's Constitutional and Bylaws and many other business items.

RA delegates are critically important as the voice of local NYSUT members. That said, the commitment is a relatively light one in terms of expectations: delegates simply attend the RA on April 30-May 1, participate in the

discussions if they wish, and vote on motions made in session. We are entitled to as many as nine (9) delegates to the RA, but we currently have two members elected last year who are serving the second year of their term. So we have openings for seven delegates and one alternate. I hope I'll see you as one of them! (The deadline for nominations is Monday March 1.)

There are plenty of other ways to get more involved in your union, as well. You can join union committees—like the Adjunct, Constitution, Faculty Development, Grievance, Solidarity, or Health and Safety Committees. You can help get others to join our union, especially adjuncts: we want to—and need to—hear adjunct voices bringing our attention to adjunct issues. Or just let me know you'd like to help out.

As President Obama has said, unions helped make the 20th Century "the American century." The 21st century is well under way, with new problems and issues, global and local, that need our attention—that need you. Now's your chance to pitch in!

ADJUNCT COMMITTEE:

Committee chair Raji Karve reports: "Many of our adjuncts have lost their course assignments and have been contemplating or are in the process of filing for unemployment insurance benefits. Scarcity of classes means more pressure on our adjunct faculty through bumping, so we are mostly busy dealing with those issues.

"Like everyone else, COVID19 vaccines are very much on our minds. Some adjuncts have been successful in their quest while others are still longingly looking for an available appointment. The pandemic keeps us from getting together in person, and many people seem to have grown weary of Zoom overload.

"Through the Constitution Committee, we are trying to improve the status and the role of the union majority, who happen to be adjunct faculty inching forward toward equality."

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT FUND:

Committee chair Rowan Lindley reports: "The WC-CFT provides faculty development funds for professional activities conducted during each academic year.
