


• What Are the Union's Objectives?

Rights & Working Conditions

- to present the faculty, full time and adjunct, in collective bargaining with the College and the County
- to achieve and maintain optimal terms and conditions of employment and a safe, healthy work environment, including (but not limited to):
 - academic freedom
 - due process
 - protection against discriminatory, arbitrary, or capricious treatment
 - workload, hours, preparations and class sizes
 - compensation
 - benefits
 - leave

Development of the College

- participation in shared governance
- professional development opportunities
- access to facilities, supplies, technology, and equipment
- faculty input on appointments to faculty or administrative positions
- recruitment of new union members
- member involvement with local, state and national unions
- to further the development of WCC as a comprehensive institution of higher learning in service of the community



•all faculty, adjunct and full-time, who are dues-paying members

Note: Faculty members who are inactive at the College for two years are removed from membership.



- •held during common hour (11:00am-1:00pm) on the first Wednesday of each month in the fall and spring semesters
- •held in person in TEC-109 and/or virtually on Zoom
- •email sent out a few days beforehand with notice of format and agenda



Who Is the Union Leadership?

The Officers

President

- presides at Union and Executive Committee meetings
- shares material and information from local, state, and national unions
- implements goals of the Union
- represents the Union on governance and policymaking bodies
- serves as ex officio member of all Union committees

Vice-President

- presides at all meetings in the absence of the President
- performs other duties as the President of the Union may delegate

Secretary

- keeps record of proceedings of all Union meetings
- makes minutes and agenda items available to the membership
- corresponds with Union members
- updates membership lists

•Treasurer

- collects dues from members
- remits "per capita" dues to affiliated bodies
- disburses sums approved by Executive Committee
- keeps proper financial records
- prepares draft of annual budget, presents it to the Executive Committee, reports it to the membership



The Executive Committee / The Executive Board (E-Board)

- •Officers
 - President
 - Vice-President
 - Secretary
 - Treasurer
- •Adjunct Representative
- •Full-Time Teaching Representative
- •Full-Time Non-Teaching Representative
- •At-Large Members



- adhere to the WCCFT Constitution
- enforce the contract
- •negotiate in good faith
- represent members fairly
- manage the day-to-day activities
- •collect dues and establish a budget
- communicate with the membership
- •chair individual committees of the Union



What Are the Union Committees?

Adjunct Committee

- chaired by the Adjunct Representative
- promotes unity among adjuncts
- improves conditions of employment
- assists the Membership Committee in recruiting new members

Budget Committee

- chaired by the Treasurer
- includes the President, Vice-President, Secretary
- assists the Treasurer in preparing the annual budget for approval by the Executive Committee
- examines financial review of the Executive Committee

Communication Committee

 communicates information from the Union leadership to the membership via Union website, Union newsletter (FT Connect), social media

Grievance Committee

- upholds the contract by investigating, writing, and submitting grievances and working with faculty and administration to resolve them
- with NYSUT Labor Relations Specialist, evaluates whether grievances should move forward to arbitration
- works to educate members about contract
- tracks and documents past practices, past grievances and resolutions
- uses current and historical information to bring negotiation points forward



Health & Safety Committee

- gathers complaints and concerns from faculty and brings them to the attention of the E-Board
- investigates faculty complaints and attempts to address them with appropriate campus parties

Membership Committee

- chaired by the Secretary
- works to increase Union membership
- ensures membership lists and records are accurate
- provides new members with orienting information about Union benefits and key documents
- conducts research into membership trends
- provides the E-Board with data on Union members

Political Action Committee

- oversees research, endorsement, and financial support of local candidates who support the Union's mission and issues
- invites candidates to one-on-one discussions and monthly general Union meetings

Professional Development Fund Committee

 administers professional development fund established in contract

Scholarship Committee

 coordinates scholarships for WCC students founded on principles of unionism

Special Committees

• created for specific, limited functions


•procedure:

first week of March: last Wednesday of March: April membership meeting: within two days of April meeting: last Wednesday of April: before May membership meeting: May membership meeting: June 1: call for nominations last day for nominations nominations announced E-Board prepares and emails out official ballot last day for voting Election Committee counts ballots election results announced new officers and members assume office



What Are the Benefits of Joining the Union?

- due process in any disciplinary action
- ability to grieve any infringement of your contractual rights
- representation by the WCCFT in a grievance hearing
- salary increases (bargained with each new contract), including retroactive payments and bonuses, as well as developmental classes paid at the credit rate
- academic freedom to teach all relevant subject matter in your courses
- one **paid sick/personal session** per course each semester for teaching adjuncts and one **paid sick/personal day** for non-teaching adjuncts
- no loss of pay for non-teaching adjuncts for a day when the College closes for emergencies
- "swap" coverage of a class with a qualified colleague instead of taking a paid sick/personal session
- credit towards seniority if "bumped" from an assigned course and if no other courses are available
- senior adjunct status after 20 semesters
- tuition waivers for WCC courses
- not be discriminated against at the College
- •limits set on class sizes, material being placed in your personnel file, and the use of student surveys in your sections
- bereavement leave if someone in your immediate family passes away, military leave if ordered for military duty, and leave for court appearances
- personalized business cards (for senior adjuncts)



- have access to union consultation and support on disciplinary and contractual issues
- apply for reimbursement for your professional development activities (up to \$2,000 per year as funds permit)
- attend **union-run training seminars** and **information sessions** on topics like Applying for Unemployment, Understanding Class Assignment Rights (CBA Section 3.9), and Understanding Discipline
- •make your voice heard and determine the direction of Union activities because you have **full voting rights** on Union issues
 - To participate in an election or ratification vote, members must have been active at the College during the academic year in which that election or ratification vote is held.
- •hold a union office, become a member of the Executive Committee, chair an E-Board committee, or become a NYSUT Delegate
- attend monthly membership meetings as well as social and informational events sponsored by the Adjunct
 Committee
- automatically qualify for specially **discounted membership** in NYSUT programs



Can I Be Discriminated Against for Being a Union Member?

NO!

•Faculty members are free to join or not join the Union.

•Faculty members will not be discriminated against by the County or the Union in regards to:

- hours
- wages
- any terms or conditions of employment
- participating in Union activities
- •The contract shall be applied in a manner that is not arbitrary, capricious, or unjustly discriminatory, without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex or marital status.

Note: On June 27, 2018, the Supreme Court ruled in Janus v. AFSCME that public sector unions can no longer collect agency fees from non-Union members (fees to cover the administration of the contract and non-Union members' representation) although the Union is still required to represent everyone in the bargaining unit.
